- Thanks to Mr Jordan's help the new barrier is in place, parents are pleased
- Mrs Middleton and Headteacher attended the Governor 'speed dating' event to share ideas with other Governing Bodies. Some of the ideas they came back with were:
 - a) One school had a Twitter account, this is something we could consider, Governors agree we would not want to use Facebook. Miss Ware could help with this and it may be a way of getting people to access our school as no one is using our website. Governor states that the Twitter account could point to the school website. Governors agree to discuss this further at next FGB meeting.

14. Headteacher's report

- We now have 109 children on roll, the highest number ever
- We have a full compliment of staff
- Q What do Governors want included in the Headteacher's report and what way do they want it presented?
 - A Staff training, which is now included is useful. Report currently gives a good overview of school. Governors agree that the format should not be changed
- Growth mindset meeting was not well attended by parents, but the ones who did gave excellent feedback
 - Q Could this information be repeated at parents evening?
 - A that would be difficult as parents arrive at different times.
 - Q Could the powerpoint used be sent home?
 - $\mathsf{A}-\mathsf{It}$ would not make sense without the verbal input. The children will pass on the information. School could direct parents to relevant website
- Headteacher attended an Ofsted meeting and was told that there is now a shortage of Ofsted inspectors and therefore it may be 2 years before we have our next visit. LA have been asked if they could conduct another review but school was informed that this would now cost £1400. A former EDA, Lou O'Brien has agreed to visit school for the day and conduct a review at a cost of £500, this will take place before Christmas,

There is also a priority on Safeguarding which includes PREVENT. Headteacher, Mrs Middleton and Mr Jordan have completed the PREVENT training, Mrs Capewell is to complete this soon and all the staff will receive training during a staff meeting shortly

15. Subject Leaders reports: Geography, maths, science

- All subject leaders are now writing reports for their subject.
 Governors agree that the format should be the same for all subjects
- Headteacher informs Governors that all subject leaders now have a handle on their subjects
- Governors agree that the reports are informative and will help focus on that particular subject, it will also mean that Governors do not need to rely on the Headteacher to report on subjects
- There is a lack of non-fiction books and new books will be purchased using £1,000 which has been donated by the Trustees. Mrs Capewell is to co-ordinate this and is working with staff to review the needs of the school
- The RIG will meet with subject leaders, this will enable the teachers confidence to grow when talking about their subjects Q – How often will this take place?

A – At least termly

18. School PAN

Q – What is PAN?

A – Pupil Admission number

Pupil numbers are increasing, Governors express their concern for the number of older children there will be in one room. Headteacher has met with Andrew Dixon from LA who has informed her that we are not a primary village, we are a secondary village

Q – What is the definition of this?

A – A primary village has a school, post office and shops.

There is to be further housing developments in the area. Governor asks if we would be eligible to a Section 106, this is an educational element to funding, from the developers. Governor states that school will need to push for this as it will not be made available otherwise. Mr Jordan to discuss this with SDC S106 officer

Q – How substantial is the funding from developers?

A – It can be used to cover improving roads, improving education and doctors surgeries

Q – So in respect of education it could be used for teaching resources and extensions?

A - Yes

Governors are currently concerned with the number of toilets in school in ratio to the number of children, we are currently within the numbers required. Mr Dixon has suggested reducing the PAN but Governors agree that this would not make any difference as parents would appeal and be admitted anyway

Q – How many children were admitted to EYFS this year?

A – 17 including 1 child on appeal

Governors consider options:

Remain at 16 - Parents would need to appeal for additional places

Reduce to 14 – This would send a message to the Council, additional children would still be admitted through appeal

Governor states that we would still want to admit any children living in the village or with siblings already in school.

We have previously had 20 children in EYFS this was 16 + an additional 4 children, if we reduced PAN to 14 then we would have admitted 14 + additional 4 which would have meant a class size of 18 instead of 20

Q – Is the PAN calculated on the size of classrooms

A – Yes, and if we decided to reduce our PAN we would need to prove why this is necessary

Governors agree PAN to remain at 16
